Energy efficiency is an important part of managing utility bills whether you are a business owner or a homeowner. There are many parts of your home or business that can be changed to increase energy efficiency. Some of these changes are low cost, while others may take thousands of dollars to complete. No matter what the level of your investment, the return that shows up in lower energy costs often pays for the improvements. The cheapest unit of energy, whether it is electricity (kW) or natural gas (Ccf) is the unit that you don't have to purchase, and you can achieve that through en-



ergy efficiency measures.

efficiency measure is a change in the type of light bulbs that you use. The Department of Energy recommends that you use Energy Star-qualified fluorescent light bulbs (CDLs) or light emitting diodes (LEDs) to decrease your electricity use.

Fluorescent light bulbs are the A good example of a low cost most cost-effective, using 75 percent less energy and radiating $\mathbf{75}$ percent less heat. They also last up to 10 times longer than a regular bulb and come in many different sizes and shapes to fit any home light fixture. When you finish using a bulb, you can often recycle it.

LEDs are more expensive but also more efficient, using 75 percent less energy and emitting no heat into a room. They last up to 25 times longer than regular bulbs and four times longer than fluorescent bulbs. Both come in a variety of color "temperatures", denoted by their K-value. If their K-value is high, then the color of the light will be more blue-tinted. If the K-value is low, then the emitted light will have more yellow hue.

If you are considering building a new home or office, or if a reno-

vation is in your plans in the coming months, you should always consider the types of energy you would like to incorporate into your overall energy efficiency strategy. For example, heating and cooling your home or business with natural gas is overall far more efficient than heating and cooling with electricity.

From the start, natural gas is "source energy" - that is, 92% of the energy that is produced at the source is actually delivered to the end user. By contrast, grid-delivered electricity is about 36% percent efficient.

You should also consider a variety of technologies. The Chesapeake Utilities office on Bay Road in Dover has natural gas-fired heat pumps used for heating and cooling. When the building was in design, Chesapeake considered three different HVAC options. When those options were compared, the gas heat pump system won the life-cycle cost analysis, which proved they were the most economical and efficient choice for the building.



<u>Cornerstone Member - Post Acute Medical</u> Post Acute Medical: An Intensive Path to High Quality Living

"We want each patient to be able to remain safely in the community with the highest quality of life they can lead," commented Erin DeFarno, Director of Strategic Initiatives for the Post Acute Medical Rehabilitation Hospital of Dover (PAM). "We truly want patients to achieve as much as they can so that they can be happy and successful and remain as independent as possible."

The team at PAM works diligently to provide meaningful improvement and recovery for people with injuries illness, and disabilities. They focus on putting the patient first and providing quality care for the medically complex and rehabilitation patients. They provide comprehensive, individualized treatment include physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, and specialty physicians and nurses. Their goal is to return each patient to his or her highest possible functional status.

PAM is the only acute rehabilitation hospital in Central Delaware. Their regimen of acute care is marked by several factors not present at sub-acute care facilities. The primary difference between treatment at PAM and treatment at a sub-acute facility is that the doctor assigned to each patient oversees the care of that patient every single day. Regulations mandate doctors in sub-acute care facilities to see patients once every 30 days.

The average length of stay for patients is much shorter than at non-acute institutions. Currently, PAM's statistics on length of stay are the lowest in the state, while their outcomes are the highest. Re-admission rates are also very low, currently less than 2%. While at the rehabilitation hospital, patients at PAM are involved in therapy programs that are extremely intense, with many scheduled sessions throughout the day. These programs are tailored to each patient's needs and abilities. "While the therapy is described as 'intense," remarked DelFarno, "it is delivered in a manner than is not intolerable. Breaks are scheduled along the way as needed and patients are challenged in a way that results in progress, not damage or frustration."

Unlike many rehabilitation centers, PAM is a true hospital. As such, the experts at PAM are able to do wound care, IV antibiotic treatments, dialysis, x-rays, respiratory therapy, and much more. They do not do any kind of surgery and they contract with Bayhealth for computerized tomography (CT scans) and magnetic resonance imaging (MRI's). PAM's staff of medical professionals includes specialists in nephrology, neurology, and orthopaedics. PAM offers a comprehensive Stroke Recovery pro-



gram and is now providing pulmonary recovery for post-COVID patients who experience neurological deficits commonly known as "COVID fog."

Each patient is assigned their own Care Team comprised of physicians, nursing staff, therapists, and family members. The Care Teams meet twice per week to discuss case management and generate options for the best possible care. Their goal always is to return the patients to their homes or other highest level of quality life. The Care Team can arrange for necessary supplies, equipment, and family training.

In addition to robust inpatient care, PAM also provides extensive outpatient services. The outpatient portion of PAM's resume helps to smooth the transition for patients from inpatient to outpatient services. When patients are allowed to return home to stay but still require outpatient therapy, they will be given the opportunity to continue their treatment with the same Care Team that already knows their conditions, needs, and goals.

In addition to an exemplary staff of medical professionals, PAM also boasts some of the latest technology available. On the first floor, the outpatient therapy gym is equipped with the KoreBalance System. This piece of equipment measures balance and helps to inform a patient's plan of treatment. The inpatient gym on the second floor of the facility boasts the Bionik Arm which provides a way for patients who are working to retrain their muscles to refine their movements through observation and repetition. Both pieces of equipment are groundbreaking in expediting a patient's recovery.

PAM is continuously operating near capacity, which demonstrates the great need for this kind of care in our community. The team at PAM is focused on the growth of the hospital as the needs of the community grow. They are constantly adding new services and programs as needs arise. They are excited to announce that the ground has been broken on the Post Acute Medical Rehabilitation Hospital of Georgetown in Sussex County.

The Class of 2021 Ends the Year with Energy!

As Leadership Central Delaware's year of day-long learning experiences came to a close with Energy & Environment Day, they gathered in a Bayhealth conference room at the Blue Hen Corporate Center for a panel discussion focused on what it means to be in the energy business in Delaware. After lunch, they hopped on a school bus for a couple of afternoon tours. As always, class members were excited to re-connect and dive into a day of learning and growing.

Dave Detrick, Manager of Sales at Chesapeake Utilities Corporation and graduate from LCD Class of 2013, gave an overview of the process involved in dealing with natural gas. For more than 100 years, his company has successfully delivered safe, secure, reliable and efficient solutions that are environmentally and economically smart. Dave spoke in detail about the various sources of natural gas, how it is cleaned, and what goes into its distribution. He also shared that the Chesapeake Utilities Corporation is now exploring the possibility of working with recyclable natural gas, which is able

to be refined with much less waste. Delaware Electric Cooperative was represented by Jesse Spam-pinato. Jesse spent his time with the class sharing information about how the Cooperative works and the role they play in providing energy to the residents of the First State. He provoked some thoughtful discussion with class members about what the future could hold for the energy business including artificial intelligence and the use of drones. In addition to sharing information about the energy business, Jesse also shared several gems of wisdom with the group about effective leadership. Class participants gained several "take-aways" from the discussion including: "Handle small things immediately and directly so they don't distract from getting the big things accomplished" and "Remember, in a discussion, that a resolution is not always mandatory... it's okay to say 'Let me get back to you on that.'"

Ed Jackson, founder and owner of

Affinity Energy Management, shared his insights on leadership. His company works as an energy broker to connect energy consumers to suppliers. He assists customers in shopping competitively for electricity and natural gas. His resume shows a remarkable career in various roles in the energy business, from worker to manager to owner. He has been a sole proprietor for 15 years. He describes his career as incredibly hard work, but as also highly gratifying. He encouraged class members to pursue their dreams. For those whose dreams include starting their own business, he advised that they need to be prepared to work hard, maintain the support of their families, and keep their day jobs as long as possible until the new start-up is ready to really sustain them.

The final member of the day's panel was class member, Heather Contant, who represented the Delaware Municipal Electric Corporation, otherwise known as DEMEC. DEMEC has been in Delaware for more than 40 years and is a joint action wholesale electric utility. The continued goal and mission of DEMEC is to advance the principles of public power community ownership and provide competitive, reliable energy supply and services to its members' communities. DEMEC accomplishes its mission through active representation and participation in regional and federal arenas. Heather shared that DEMEC, currently working to enter the electric vehicle charging station arena, stresses the impor-

tance of leading through innovation. The class had the unique opportunity to visit Chesapeake Utilities new training facility, "Safety Town." Safety Town's training rooms and shed-like houses (built by students from Polytech) were built on a 2-acre parcel of Chesapeake's Energy Lane campus. The homes give workers a simulated experience of what they may encounter as they enter customer homes on installation and repair calls. Class member Anthony Coker of Chesapeake Utilities joined Dave Detrick and Steve Tull in explaining the facility to the class and underscoring the importance of safety training. Follow the Safety Town tour, the class had the opportunity to see the station where Natural Gas Vehicles can fill their tanks with Compressed Natural Gas (CNG).

After a delicious lunch by Woody's on Wheels, the Class of 2021 boarded the bus and headed out on two interesting and eye-opening tours. The first stop of the afternoon was at the Kent County Waste-Water Treatment Facility & Solar Field where William Vincent, Plant Supervisor, explained the intricate process of managing waste-water. This experience was a highly informative and somewhat "scented" experience!

Next, the class traveled to Delaware Solid Waste Authority's Sandtown Landfill. Facility Manager, Mike Lenkiewics, joined class members on the bus for a tour around the landfill. Sandtown accepts all the solid waste collected by DSWA trash collection vehicles, as well as tires,

asbestos, household yard waste, and much more. The Class of 2021 even got a glimpse of the landfill's resident goat heard, now numbering about 30!

Energy & Environment Dav turned out to be an informa-tion-packed day for the class members. They were extremely engaged in the conversations and asked many questions. They seemed very interested in what the energy of the future would enable people to do differently. actly what the Annual LCD Closing Retreat is all about. The Closing Retreat is designed to be part educational and part reflective, all in an effort to place a bold exclamation mark at the end of this year's LCD story.

On Friday, June 11th, class members gathered at The Great Hall of St. Andrew's Lutheran Church for a full day of presentations and conversations. Our first special guest speaker of the day was Javier Santana of High Ground Creative who spoke with our emerging leaders about the importance of imagination in leadership. Javier shared that leadership is all about relationships. "Leaders," he said, "are storytellers. Stories con-nect people – and leadership is about connect-ing." Javier emphasized that a person with no Javier emphasized that a person with no imagination can not be a leader and shared seven principles for leading with imagination includ-ing the importance of embracing relationships, demonstrating authenticity and humility, tolerating curiosity, employing humor - just to name a few. Javier also underscored the importance of building trust as a leader and maintaining a quiet, non-arrogant confidence that says (as his mother told him), "Let people feel the weight of who you are – and let them deal with it." Javier ended his time with the class by quoting lyrics from sever-al songs including Disney's "One Little Spark": "Imagination, imagination. A dream, can be, a dream come true. With just that spark, from me and you.^{*}

ership journey. Tammy was honest and sincere and allowed herself to be very vulnerable with her audience. Born at the Dover Air Force Base hospital and into a military family, Tammy understood that excellence and achievement was expected. From a very young age, she established in herself a drive to always learn and always improve. She did, however, like many, find herself dealing with feelings of inadequacy and a lack of self confidence as she finished school and entered the workforce. In 2005, she was presented with the opportunity to experience Leadership Central Delaware, where she found the motivation, courage, and direction she needed to expand her network, make connections, ask for help, widen her circle of influence, and much more. As she began practicing these skills, she discovered a change in her mindset, a new awareness of who she is and what she has to offer, and an unquenchable thirst to give back to the community by serving on boards and committees and engaging in community service. Her leadership journey taught her to begin surrounding herself with people who were not "just like her" and experience more di-verse perspectives. "More perspectives," Ordway shared, "give you a balanced understanding." The class was completely engaged in the presentation and found Tammy's story inspiring, motivating, and empowering.

The final speaker of the day was Rev. Dr. John G. Moore, Sr., Director of Philanthropy and Engagement at the United Way of Delaware, Associate Pastor of Dover Christian Church, and nationally known impersonator of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. After several requests to have John return after his presentation on Media & Communications Day, John was invited to come to the Closing Retreat to share with the group a leadership presentation on group dynamics, prejudice, and diversity. John's presentation was engaging, relevant, and eye opening as he asked the group to do some acutely personal reflection. As class mem-bers began to share with John and the group, the discussion took on a whole new life, offering valuable and critical information necessary for anyone

in a leadership role. Once again, Rev. Moore's insights and perspectives resonated with class members and gave them much to think about as each of them continues their leadership journey.

The Class of 2021 also spent some time intentionally remembering and reflecting on the various aspects of their LCD experience including their monthly experiences, their class book: It's Your Ship, their journals, their Community Im-pact Project, and more. The conversation was pact Project, and more. The conversation was built around the theme, "What Did It All Mean?" While class members enjoyed the many facets of the program and felt like they gained a great deal of knowledge from the various speakers and presenters throughout the year, they all agreed that they learned the most from their 23 "new best friends" who made up the Class of 2021. Class members offered valuable suggestions for additions to the program in the future. They were ea-ger to share their discoveries and their learnings from the year and showed a great deal of gratitude for having been part of the Chamber's "Diamond Program.

The Closing Retreat came to its conclusion with a Happy Hour toast to the Class of 2021 and a specially designed slide show presentation of photos from the past year. Class members, presenters, and volunteers experienced a full day and left with full hearts as they spoke about graduation, next steps, and plans for remaining in touch.
