# Delaware is a Growing State!

The members of the Leadership Central Delaware (LCD) Class of 2022 enjoyed an informative and eye-opening day on the first Thursday of October as they learned all about Agriculture and Agritourism in the First State. They had the opportunity to hear directly from the people who work in the industry, whose business is the science and art of cultivating plants and livestock.

With 2,450 farms (that's 510,250 acres, 115,000 of which are permanently preserved for agriculture), 42 percent of Delaware's land is devoted to farming. Responsible for 30,000 jobs and an economic impact of \$7.95 billion per year, Agriculture is a huge industry and a major economic driver in Delaware. Class members learned that Delaware truly is a "growing state" – we grow things here!

The state's top crop is field corn, used to feed livestock and make ethanol, which covers two-fifths of Delaware's cultivated land, whose expected annual revenue is over \$100 million. Wheat, soybeans, peaches and other fruits and vegetables play a major role as well. It is no surprise to any Delawarean that poultry is the No. 1 agricultural product. This tradition of producing chickens began in 1923 by Cecile Steele who mistakenly received 500 chickens when she had only ordered 50; she chose to keep them and nurture them – and the poultry industry in Delaware was born! Who could have known that the Delaware poultry industry would grow to be the largest broiler chicken industry in the world, yielding \$946 million annually? Delaware is also the No. 1 lima producing state and the No. 8 watermelon producing state in the United States. LCD class members learned, without a doubt, that agriculture is a BIG DEAL in Delaware.

This incredible day of learning began at Harrington Raceway & Casino with a presentation by Michael Scuse, Secretary for the Department of Agriculture. In his time with the class, he shared information about the agriculture industry and what it means to the state. He also discussed work being done to preserve farmland here in the First State. Currently, one of every four acres in Delaware represents permanently protected and preserved farmland. He spoke about the demands that will be placed in coming years on the industry as the population increases in major urban areas that are in close proximity to Delaware. He stressed the need to eliminate food waste which has grown to a shocking 40 percent in the United States, about 10 percent higher than the rest of the civilized world. The Secretary also spoke a bit about the improvements and new technologies that have been integrated into the tradition of farming and the introduction of urban farming to the

Secretary Scuse shared the importance of data-driven decision making in leadership and the need to develop the skills to be able to forecast potential needs and situations that may change the course of one's business. Planning and the ability to provide necessary resources are also part of his work as Delaware's leader of the agriculture industry.

The class also had the opportunity to hear from a panel of speakers who are experts on the topic of agriculture: James Fischer of Delmarva Poultry Industry, Inc.; Bobbi Jo Webber of Webber Family Farms; and Curt Fifer of Fifer Orchards. Panelists enlightened the group on a variety of issues related to agriculture and farming. They emphasized the importance of educating the community about the industry, especially the youth. They spoke about their concern regarding succession and who will follow in their footsteps to keep the industry, alive as well as

the expense of getting started in the industry. They also talked a bit about the natural tension that exists between the importance of development and the necessity of farming.

In addition to an emphasis for the day on agriculture, the class also took a close look at the related industry of agritourism. A relatively new term, "agritourism" refers to an increasingly popular and growing opportunity for agricultural producers which links agriculture and tourism. Agritourism is generally marked by activities that include visiting a working farm, ranch or other agricultural business to enjoy the rural setting, be educated, or be involved in a special activity. Agritourism brings agricultural awareness to individuals while generating another source of income for the agricultural location.

For their first agritourism adventure of the day, the class boarded a school bus and headed to Harvest Ridge Winery in Marydel. There, the class were treated to a tour of the winery and a discussion of how wine is made, followed by an introduction into wine tasting and a sampling of three of the winery's top sellers.

The next stop of the day was a tour of Fifer Orchards, where Jessica Yocum talked about the wide variety of fruits and vegetables in Fifer's inventory. The class was astonished at the number of varieties there are of peaches and apples! Ms. Yocum described Fifer's as a "family" business and explained that, regardless of the scope of their reach, they wish to always be known as a "family" business. Jessica spoke at length about the critical partnerships that exist between Fifer's and other members of the business and farming community. She stressed the importance of sharing one's story as a vehicle for remaining connected to the community. The class was also treated to a wagon ride and tour of the fields

where Fifer's amazing crops are grown and harvested.

The end of this exciting hands-on day of learning brought the class back to Harrington Raceway & Casino for a visit to the paddock and an introduction to the world of harness racing. Class members were thrilled to see the paddock up close and very excited to meet two racehorses! Matt Sparacino, Harrington's public relations director and assistant general manager of Racing, explained a bit about the multi-million-dollar industry of horse racing. In hearing about the industry, meeting racehorse owner Jeff Startt and trainer Martin Davis and spending time with the horses, participants learned about the importance of communication and trust. From the connection between the horse and its trainer, to the partnership between the trainer and the owner, to the relationship between the owner and the staff at the track and the local community, clear and open communication is a key factor in building the vital component of trust.

The day wrapped up with a book discussion of the beginning of It's Your Ship by Capt. Michael Abrashoff. This required reading for the year is a wonderful story about the impact that effective leadership can have on building a healthy climate and maintaining excellence and success. Leah Gray and Beatrice Smith led the class in a discussion of the author's note and introduction which served as a great support for the focused leadership traits of the day, entrepreneurship and succeeding as a business owner.

# Making a Positive Impact on the Community

A significant part of our Leadership Central Delaware curriculum each year requires class members to work together on projects that will benefit the community. These Community Impact projects help students to apply their newly acquired and continuously developing leadership skills to real-life situations that will help other members of the Central Delaware community. These projects are submitted each year by non-profit member businesses and are voted on by class members during the Opening Retreat.

The LCD Class of 2022 listened carefully to the details of each proposal and discussed how each project aligned with the gifts, talents and timeframe of the group. At the end of the discussion, they selected two projects to complete during their LCD experience. The first project was proposed from the United Way of Delaware. The building they share with the Delaware Multicultural and Civic Organization (DEMCO) needs some tender loving care. They are looking for capital upgrades of painting, cleaning around the building, and landscaping to enhance the appearance of this community facility that provides programs for hundreds of families and

The second project will benefit Read Aloud Delaware. Read Aloud is in need of gently used books in excellent condition. These books will be distributed throughout the community at schools and State Service Centers, as well as at community events like the Delaware State Fair, Dover Days, Rider Pride Day, I Love Smyrna Day and others. Donated books are also used to replenish the agency's in-house book collection used by volunteers in their Volunteer Reading Program.

Under the leadership of project managers, Beatrice Smith and Leigh DeSantis for the Book Drive, and Ryne Johnson and Lauren Webb for the building clean up, class members have come together to begin their work of planning and preparation for the projects ahead. Book collection boxes have already started to appear in class members' workplaces and here at the CDCC. Plans are being made to gather the materials needed for the building project as well.

Class members are seeking donations of materials or funding to assist them in their work. While providing class members with the opportunity to learn leadership on the job, each of these projects also has the potential to impact many lives here in Central Delaware.

# Jen-Mor Celebrates 50 Years!

In 1971, Walt Disney World opened in Florida. Also that year, the Pittsburgh Pirates won the World Series, Apollo 15 became the fourth crew mission to land on the moon, and the Baltimore Colts won the Super Bowl. And here in Central Delaware, Jen-Mor Florist opened its doors for the very first time!

After growing up in Reading, Pa., John Zimmerman came to Dover via the United States Air Force. When his enlisted time came to an end in 1952, he continued his work at Dover Air Force Base in civil service,

working on planes until 1971. John married Kent County native, Jane Clark, in 1952.

Early in John's life, he had some experience working in a nearby flower shop. Prior to enlisting in the Air Force, he spent four years working for a grower. When his time at DAFB ended, and an opportunity arose to purchase a shop, horticulture seemed like a natural fit. Jane, who enjoyed a 25-year career at Acme Markets, started in the flower business working days at the flower shop and nights at the Acme, until she eventually came on board at the flower shop full

"I remember Dad gathering us kids together," reminisced daughter, Susan (Zimmerman) Krabill. "He said, 'Your mom and I are thinking of opening a flower shop.' At the time, it seemed more like a hobby than anything. Who would have thought it would turn out like this?!"

The business began in a very small space that is sometimes described as a shed. As the company grew, additions were needed, and about 20 years ago, the shop evolved into what customers see today, including a small showroom, ample workspace, a greenhouse and one of the largest flower coolers in the region.

Jen-Mor, which has come to be known as "Dover's Florist," has been a family business from its inception. All six Zimmerman siblings grew up in the flower business, and today, in the wake of their parents' passing, four continue to run the business together. Each of them lends their own expertise to the company. Gina



Fries takes care of the accounting, ordering and computer aspects of the business. Mike Zimmerman serves as the master designer. Susan Krabill is also a master designer, working mainly in weddings, funerals and events.

John Zimmerman is the general manager, taking care of the day-to-day operations of the business. Since 1971, four generations of Zimmermans have worked in the family business.

The Zimmerman children describe the rest of their approximately

20-person team as part of their extended family. Most

members of the staff
have been with the
company for many
years – there is
very little turnover
at Jen-Mor. Using
flowers from local
growers when possible,
as well as flowers from
around the world, the team

at Jen-Mor works diligently to deliver beautiful bouquets and smiles all over Kent County and sometimes, beyond.

Much like the staff that celebrates longevity, Jen-Mor enjoys a loyal customer base that has been coming to them for many years. "The tradition of buying flowers at Jen-Mor sometimes gets passed down from one generation to the next!" remarked Gina. While customers love coming in to buy flowers for friends and family members or centerpieces for holiday tables, about 70% of the shop's business is delivery.



In recent years, the number of florists in the United States has dramatically decreased. "Forty years ago, there might have been about 40,000 florists in our country," John Zimmerman commented. "Today, the number of real retail florists is more like 8,000."

As far as competition, John explained that the internet is their biggest competitor. He warned customers to beware of internet scammers who pose as florists, but who are simply "order gatherers" who attempt to obtain flowers from true florists and sell them online to unsuspecting customers after pocketing a huge percentage. When customers pay less for bouquets and arrangements, they sacrifice quality. "It's kind of like my dad always said," John mused, "You get what you pay for"

As proud members of the Central Delaware community, the folks at Jen-Mor have established a legacy of giving back. They love to sponsor activities and events, especially those involving youth like schools, local teams and so forth. "It's important to support them," explained John, "They will be our future."

The team at Jen-Mor is thrilled that last year's shutdowns, due to the global pandemic, are over and their staff is back together. During the months following the closure of many businesses, Jen-Mor was able to re-open, but they were forced to furlough their employees. The shop was able to continue arranging and delivering flowers on a limited basis with just the four Zimmerman siblings working to fill orders. At a time when many people were experiencing tragedy and crisis, it was important to the Zimmerman family to give them a way to bring warmth and cheer to their loved ones. Gina cited a recent study by Rutgers University that proved something we already know: "Flowers make people happier."

Currently, plans are in the works for Jen-Mor's annual Christmas Open House. This year's event will focus on the shop's 50th anniversary and promises to be bigger than ever! The Open House features the long-awaited unveiling of the special Holiday Room in the greenhouse, cookies, door prizes, and of course, a visit with Santa Claus. This year's event will also feature a special performance by legendary singer and songwriter, Mike Hines & The Look. Now in his 35th year with The Look, Mike is a long-time customer and supporter of Jen-Mor. The Christmas Open House will be held on Sunday, Nov. 21, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Jen-Mor.

# 75th Anniversary Racing Season Concludes in Harrington

Harrington Raceway's 75th anniversary season of live harness racing came to a close with a 15-race card on Wednesday, Oct. 20.

The half-mile racetrack formerly known as Kent and Sussex Raceway, is part of a harness racing mecca in Harrington where many of racing's biggest stars have been based, including 3 national horses of the year in the past 20 years.

A 65-day meet was conducted this year with highlights including the annual Governor's Day program during the Delaware State Fair in July and the Bobby Quillen Memorial held in September, which again drew some of racing's finest horses. This year's event was won by Australian-bred horse, None Bettor A. Prior year's events have drawn some of racing's top stars such as former Horse of the Year, Wiggle It Jiggleit, and the richest pacer of all-time, Foiled Again, who has won the Quillen 3 times.

Closing night ceremonies included leading driver and trainer accolades being presented to Allan Davis (driver) and Chuck Crissman Jr. (trainer) respectively. Davis (135 wins), who won back-to-back titles, led the standings most of the meet over Montrell Teague, Art Stafford Jr., Patrick Berry



and Victor Kirby. Davis is the son of perennial former driving champ Eddie Davis, who won over 8,000 races in his career and is well known among Delaware racing fans from his career that spanned approximately 50 years.

Davis closed out the meet with 5 wins on the closing night program. Former Harrington driving champion Art Stafford Jr. had a driving triple, including Scuola Hanover (\$4), who was coming off 2 straight wins in New York at Yonkers Raceway and has had a banner season with more than \$165,000 earned for trainer and co-owner Andrew Stafford, who had 2 wins on the closing night card. Scuola Hanover also won the annual Legislator's Cup on Governor's Day on July 29th.

Also on closing week, George Leager's Slick Tony won his second Horse Of the Meet award, as presented by the Delaware Valley Chapter of USHWA. The 6-year-old pacer won 8 races at the meet and is a former Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund champion at ages 2 and 3.

Live racing in Delaware will now shift 20 miles north to Dover Downs, which will commence a Monday through Thursday schedule starting November 1st and run until April 2022, when live racing will resume at Harrington (date TBA). Post time nightly is 4:30 p.m.

Originally founded over 15 years ago by a pair of Delaware State University alumni with the intent to present HBCU athletics, HSRN has transitioned from a seasonal sports network to a full-time, 24/7 programming service, offering a variety of community-building content together with wellness, economics, and education. During the past 15 years, HSRN has presented more live HBCU sports than any other radio or television source.

HSRN also offers several non-sports programs. Because it is not limited by the geographical signal reach of traditional terrestrial radio stations, HSRN programming is available to listeners around the world via the internet and HSRN's mobile app.

Now in its fourth season as the flagship broadcaster for Delaware State University football and basketball, HSRN has a unique connection to the Hornets. HSRN CEO Omarr Bashir and network co-founder Mike Walker are former Hornet football players. A veteran of over 50 years as a play-by-play announcer, Gary Laing is a DSU graduate and adjunct professor, and is joined in the football press box by color analyst Leroy Thompson, another Hornet football alum.

HSRN also works with Delaware State University on an intern program, affording the opportunity for a student in the Mass Communications curriculum to gain practical experience through involvement in sports broadcasting and learning the roles of production and announcing. The student receives credits toward their degree via the internship. HSRN also created a "12th Man" program that allows Hornets fans to financially support all athletic programs at the University.

HSRN joined the Central Delaware Chamber of Commerce to increase its local visibility in the business community and participate in Chamber activities. Networking events will allow HSRN to make local businesses aware of unique and creative advertising opportunities, along with businesses that have a need to reach a targeted audience outside of Delaware. HSRN also recognizes the many programs offered by the Chamber that benefit the community and hopes to participate as a locally owned and minority-owned business

HRSN's slogan is "Putting the You in HBCU." From the original network goal to spotlight HBCU sports, to featuring varied life-style programming for the HBCU community, HSRN spotlights topics of interest for their audience. Taking full advantage of new media possibilities afforded by streaming via the internet and the HSRN app, listeners are not limited to signal strength or other geographical constraints, but can listen anywhere, anytime, via PC, laptop, tablet, iPad, or cell phone.

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
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
