Can Exterior Home Improvements Be Done in the Winter?



No, that's not Santa and his reindeer making an early rooftop appearance, but it could be our team of merry roofers. Yes, G. Fedale Roofing and Siding does work in the winter! We work year-round and are able to complete many exterior home improvement projects regardless of colder temperatures.

Roofs

"Anything non-flat pretty much can be done throughout the winter. This would include asphalt-shingle roofs if the temperatures are in the low 30s and rising, and any temperature for metal, slate, or cedar roofs," says G. Fedale Production Manager Jesse Feasel. A steeper roof pitch is not a deterrent, however, flat roofs, such as EDPM or TPO, require slightly warmer temperatures because of the adherence process. Here, we follow the manufacturer's guidelines to assure the integrity of the glue. While the colder conditions do allow for roof repair or replacement, safety issues remain a constant and could delay completion or daily start times. We keep an eye on the weather realizing an early morning frost may compromise the safety of our crew, as will freezing rain or snow. With darkness occurring earlier, our workday, likewise, is shortened.

Siding

With vinyl siding installation, the key concern is proper spacing. As vinyl will expand and contract based on climatic changes, it's important to assure the spacing will allow for expansion in the warmer months in order to prevent cracking. Vinyl siding can be installed in temperatures below 30° Fahrenheit, while James Hardie fiber cement siding is not negatively impacted by colder temperatures.



Windows and Doors

As window installation is done one at a time, the home's ambient temperature shouldn't be an issue. Here again, following manufacturer's recommendations is key, with keen attention paid to the flashing tape used.

Paint

Generally, it's best to wait until warmer weather for an exterior painting job. Instead, heat up some cocoa, put on your favorite holiday music, and paint to your heart's content, but inside!

LCD Hometown Tourists for a Day!

The Central Delaware Chamber of Commerce (CDCC) Leadership Central Delaware (LCD) of Class of 2024 recently embarked on an exciting journey to explore the diverse and vibrant tourism offerings in the heart of Delaware. Tourism Day, organized as part of their leadership development program, provided an opportunity for participants to gain insights into the region's cultural, historical, and recreational attractions. "Wow, I didn't know this was here" was the recurring catch phrase of the day - and for great reason.

The day kicked off with a short check-in at the Holiday Inn Express & Suites in Dover for a hot breakfast, courtesy of General Manager and Co-Chair of the day, Juli Maichle (LCD Class of 2008). Shortly after, the class took their comfy seats for a presentation on the "State of Tourism in Kent County" from Pete Bradley, President of Kent County Tourism Corporation. Bradley did a wonderful job setting the tone for the day to come. He provided an enlightening presentation on the statistics of the tourism industry in Kent County, major events, and revenue numbers. Per his presentation, did you know "Delaware tourism is the 4th largest private employer in the state, employing 47,760 people?", and also that "the tourism industry generated \$620 million in state and local government taxes and fees in Fiscal Year 2021." Without a doubt, tourism in Delaware is very strong and a critical economic driver to the state and its residents.

Bradley's discussion was the perfect segue into our panel consisting of key movers and shakers in the Kent County Tourism Industry: Pete Bradley, Juli Maichle, Eric Williams (founder & owner of Mispillion River Brewing), Kristin Garramone (co-owner of Roma Italian Restaurant in Dover), Gary Camp (Director of Marketing at Dover Motor Speedway), and Mike Fennemore & Jessica Doran (Owner and CSA coordinator at Fifer Orchards). Each introduced themselves and shared their company's role in the impact of tourism from Agri-Tourism to hometown

dining experiences and large-scale events. The panelists exemplified and highlighted the benefit of depending on each other to do business and that is a big strength of the Delaware business community. Each panelist added a unique viewpoint to tourism in Kent County. The CDCC wished to thank them for taking time out of their busy schedules to share their world with the class.

In December, it was time to bundle up to arrive at our next tourist stop - Bombay Hook National Wildlife Refuge (BHNWR). The class met in the auditorium with the very knowledgeable, Oscar Reed, Manager, and Joshua Smith, Visitor Services Manager, for a brief overview, history, and impact of the refuge. They both explained the level of visitors that refuge sees every year. The refuge attracts schools, visitors from across the nation, photographers of all regions, and casual visitors. The refuge accommodates both local residents looking for a relaxing walk to the avid wildlife enthusiasts. BHNWR is known for its bird diversity, with over 300 species recorded, especially during the migration seasons. The refuge covers an area of about 16,251 acres, making it one of the largest wildlife refuges in the mid-Atlantic region. The refuge is open year-round, and there are various access points for visitors. It will be an even more popular destination for nature enthusiasts, photographers, and birdwatchers with the newly-constructed, state-of-the-art Visitor Welcome Center!

After an energizing lunch catered by Select Pizza & Grill in Smyrna, the LCD class of 2024 headed to a tourist destination in the top 10% of all listings on Tripadvisor - The Air Mobility Command (AMC) Museum. The award singles out not just popular choices, but truly exceptional ones that travelers keep coming back for and is the highest honor Tripadvisor can bestow. This is proof that we have a world class museum right here in Dover, Delaware. You could certainly spend a few days reading, viewing, and basking in the historic aircrafts onsite at the AMC Museum, however the class received a brief 1-hour highlight tour of what this inspiring destination has to offer. Thank you to Director, Michael Hurlbert, for his enthusiasm and accommodations in making this possible. The CDCC is so appreciative of this local gem and encourages the LCD class, residents, and visitors to block out a day to enjoy this museum.

The afternoon ahead led the class to historic Downtown Dover to experience the Johnson Victrola Museum and Walking Tour of the Green by First State Heritage Park. The museum features exhibits that showcase the history of sound recording, including various models of phonographs, gramophones, and Victrolas produced by the Victor Talking Machine Company. The museum houses one of the largest collections of artifacts, documents, and memorabilia related to the Victor Talking Machine Company and the early days of sound recording. This little hidden 2-story gem is quite a unique experience of which many Delawareans are not aware.

On the other hand, First State Heritage Park is well-known to vistors and residents alike. First State Heritage Park hosts various events and programs throughout the year, ranging from historical reenactments to educational programs. These activities aim to engage visitors and provide a deeper understanding of Delaware's history. Unlike traditional parks with a defined boundary, First State Heritage Park consists of a collection of historical sites and museums spread throughout the downtown area. Visitors can explore these sites seamlessly. One of the popular ways to explore First State Heritage Park is through walking tours, which the LCD class partook in guided by two enthusiastic role-playing tour guides. These tours often highlight specific themes or periods in history, allowing visi-

tors to delve into different aspects of Delaware's history, especially pertaining to the centralized meeting hub – The Green.

Last, but certainly not least, the LCD Class finished their day at Dover Motor Speedway on the Monster Mile. They received the VIP treatment of taking the elevator up to the lavish top floor viewing suites reserved for the most devout NASCAR fans. The class met with Patrick Long, Director of Event Operations, to hear how the company has innovated the 85,000+ event space in a post-pandemic entertainment and tourism world. In addition to NA-SCAR races, Dover Motor Speedway has hosted other motorsport events and series, contributing to its reputation as a versatile racing facility. They are making big changes to welcome not only NASCAR fans to the area, but also free entertainment for all demographics surrounding their races and events.

The Leadership Central Delaware Class of 2024's Tourism Day was a resounding success, offering a brief but comprehensive overview of the region's tourism assets. From nationally recognized attractions to outdoor adventures, participants gained a holistic perspective on the vibrant tapestry that makes Central Delaware a unique destination. As these emerging leaders continue their journey, the CDCC hopes that the class's experience of Tourism Day will help shape their understanding of community, collaboration, and the importance of promoting the treasures of Central Delaware. The CDCC is excited that the LCD Class of 2024 was able see their home through a new lens and enjoyed being hometown tourists for a day.

So, What Does That Mean?

As I'm sure you've heard and read, your CDCC has, for the third time, been awarded its 5-Star Re-Accreditation Designation. Thank you so much for all the best wishes, congratulations, hugs, and smiles you've shared on this incredible accomplishment! We appreciate your encouragement and support – and as we've said many times, it's not about the plaque that hangs on the wall or the reason to brag (although, that's pretty fun!), it's about what happens every day with our members. It clearly "takes a village," and we are certain that we have the best village around!

As for "what does it mean," please allow me to share the numbers. There are approximately 7,000 chambers in the United States. Of those, 199 are accredited by the U. S Chamber of Commerce. Beyond regular accreditation, chambers are encouraged to "level up" to star designations by demonstrating extra programs and services they offer that will have a positive impact on their communities. Chambers can be awarded 3, 4, or 5 stars by undergoing an exhaustive comparison to the chambers in our country that have been deemed the best.

This chamber was awarded 3 stars in 2008 and then 5 stars in 2013, 2018, and now 2023. Of those 199 accredited chambers, 146 have achieved 5 stars, including the CDCC. Our 5-star accreditation puts us into the top 2% of chambers in the country.

On the flip side – and fun to think about – when other chambers

choose to go for 5 stars, guess who they compare them to? That's right - us!

Many of you have expressed a curiosity over what kind of feedback we've received from the U.S. Chamber of Commerce specifically about our chamber. Over the next three months, I am happy to break that down for you in a series of articles in our Chamber Connections newspaper, beginning with this one. In this article, I am happy to talk about the specific focus areas of the accreditation self-study.

There are nine specific focus areas in the accreditation self-study. We are expected to demonstrate a certain level of mastery in each of these to be worthy of accreditation. These areas include governance, finance, human resources, government affairs, program development, technology, communications, facilities, and benchmarking. Within these sections, one can find everything there is to examine about the work of our chamber. At the end of the process, we receive feedback in each of these areas that will motivate growth and change over the next five years until we go through the whole process again.

Several volunteer co-chairs assisted us in gathering information and accomplishing tasks in each of these areas – we owe each of them a tremendous thank you: Mike Petit de mange, Tammy Ordway, Janie Libby, Lincoln Willis, Judy Diogo, Javier Santana, David Greene, Denise Vendrick, Sand Hoffman, Brian Stetina, and Dana Wattay.

We are very pleased to report that

we received perfect scores in three of these nine areas: communications, facilities, and benchmarking. In communications, we were able to share with the commission our work in keeping our members connected to the information they need. We were able to highlight our extra publications and broadcasts during the pandemic and the feedback from our community that we had served as the "hub" of information for all Central Delaware.

In facilities, we were able, with the help of our friends at Chesapeake Utilities, to provide CPR, First Aid & Defibrillator Training to our staff members, as well as active shooter and fire extinguisher training. We conducted a facility inspection and hosted a workday to address both safety and cosmetic concerns about our building.

The area of benchmarking addresses our goals. At the end of the last accreditation, we set 5 goals for growth, and we felt good about achieving them! These goals all had to do with increasing membership, increasing engagement, increasing retention, and maintaining our 5-star designation. We did very well with all these goals – despite the COVID 19 pandemic.

We have now used the feedback gathered this time to set 5 new goals for growth. The new goals include growing our membership, increasing retention, implementing a Small Business Think Tank, implementing a Virtual Networking Program, and creating a new Mastery Component to the Leadership Central Delaware program. Reaching goals and setting new goals all falls into the benchmarking section.

In the other sections, suggestions were made for our consideration that could help us be even more effective. The accreditation requires that the chamber maintain a monetary reserve of at least 6 months of operating expenses. In the past, we have done that and our average over the last six months met that mark, but due to a decrease in revenue because of the pandemic, we fell a little below that mark at the time our report was submitted. That is an area that needs to be addressed.

In addition, while we worked diligently to upgrade our technology in the building over the last year or so, we were encouraged to also explore new kinds of technology that could help us to work smarter instead of harder. Some of that will be addressed as our new and improved website comes to fruition. We were also encouraged to add a couple of additional employee benefits to our already robust package.

Next month, we'll share some areas of our work together that were specially highlighted in a section called "Special Recognition and Areas of Note." In March, we'll end our series by sharing the U. S Chamber's Final comments and more information about our goals for the next five years.

Thank you so much for the privilege of serving you, our members, and for all that you do every day to make Central Delaware the amazing place it is to live, work, and play.

KSI Celebrates Renovations at Skill Development Center with Ribbon Cutting

On Tuesday, December 12, a host of guests gathered at KSI's Milford Skill Development Center on North Rehoboth Blvd., Milford to celebrate the renovation recently completed on the Life Enrichment Program area.

This first phase of KSI's renovation was largely funded by a Community Reinvestment Grant from the State of Delaware. The new area boasts lower ceilings with acoustical tiles for better sound control, upgraded computer systems, more efficient HVAC utilities for comfort with a four-unit air system equipped with fresh air intakes to ensure healthy circulation, mid-room retractable partitions will create separate learning spaces to avoid distractions during life skills lessons and a new exterior ramp making emergency exits more manageable. The agency

goal is to renovate all other programming areas at an estimated cost of \$3.3 million.

KSI is a not for profit agency, providing vocational training, employment, community integration, transportation, day habilitation, and nutritional services to individuals with disabilities throughout Kent and Sussex Counties. KSI is committed to making all reasonable accommodations in order to ensure that our programs and services are as accessible as possible to as many people as possible. proud of the success of our nearly 700 graduates. Many of our graduates raise their income by \$50,000+ (on average) and the vast majority (around 65-85%) secure jobs within the first 6-9 months of completing the training program. We are also proud of the strong connections we have with employers who hire our students! Our work directly supports the talent pipeline of local tech employers that, in turn, support the workers of our state and keep our economy going," explained Executive Director, Desa Burton.

The bootcamp collaborates with leading tech companies, providing students with opportunities to connect with potential employers and gain real-world insights. This network has proven instrumental in helping graduates secure positions with reputable organizations. An example of this proved to be effective at their recent Career Training Fair.

The event was held at Wilmington University's Campus in Dover on November 29th from 3-6pm. This free and open to the public event featured career navigators from Zip Code Wilmington, Wilmington University, My Sister's Keeper, Futures First Gaming, NerdIt Cares, Code Differently, Polytech Adult Education, Goodwill, the Department of Labor, and the Delaware WorkForce Development Board. As you just read, there was a variety of vendors looking to help attendees match with a perfect position for them in coding. Burton, was very excited to bring





We operate on the central eastern shore of Maryland and Central Delaware with our primary business in Dover running from Smyrna to Milford. I LOVE what I do. Kids smile when they see me. Sometimes I do magic tricks in the serving window," continued Miller.

"My dad runs one of my other trucks and helps with running the business, day to day operations. My mother, bless her heart, calls herself the 'free mom labor' and handles all marketing, booking and fundraising appointments....I just show up and have fun! My parents are my behindthe-scenes support, and I couldn't manage without them. I already have expansion plans for a gourmet coffee truck in late summer 2024 or fall. Sky's the limit where serving my community is concerned. My grandmother always said, 'feed the people!"" recalled Miller.

"Being an integral part of my community was instilled in me by my mother from early childhood.
